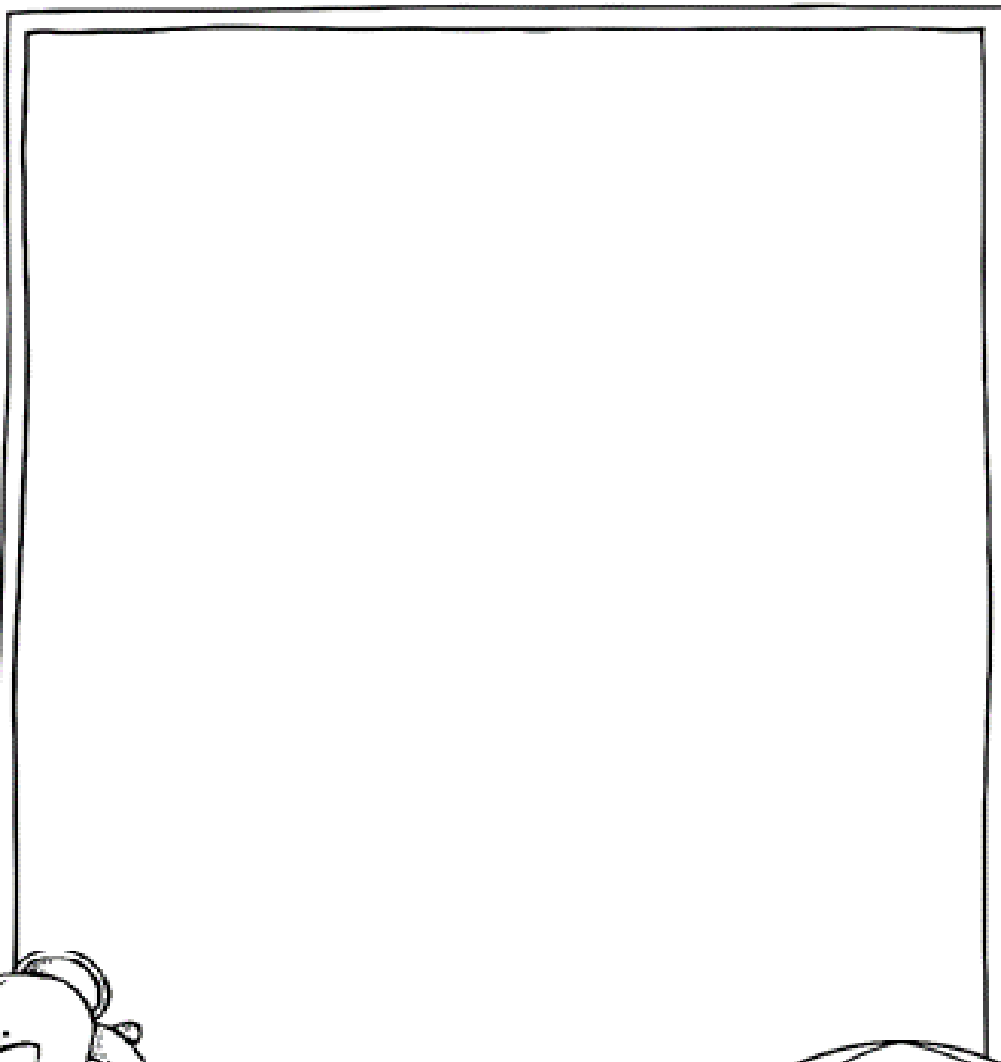
In the Arctic



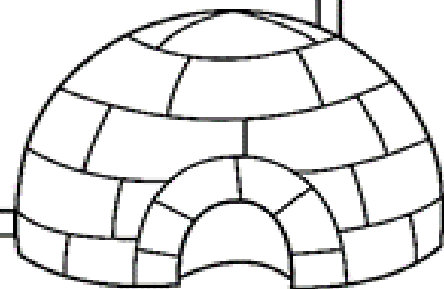
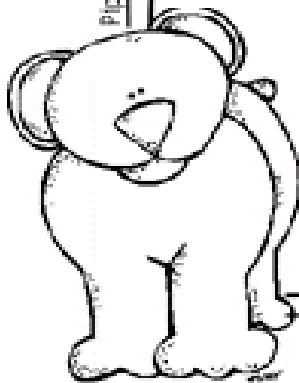

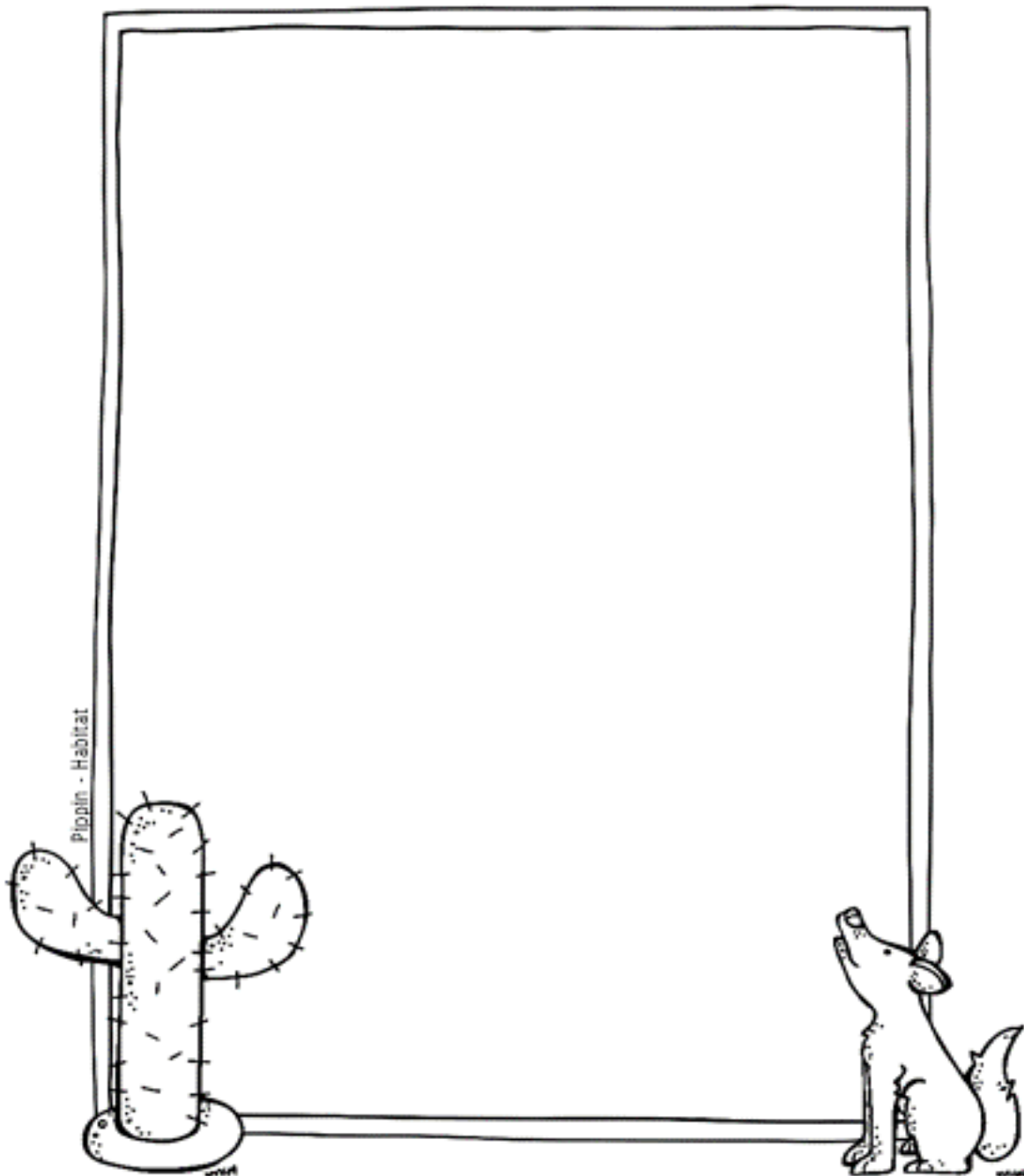
In the Desert

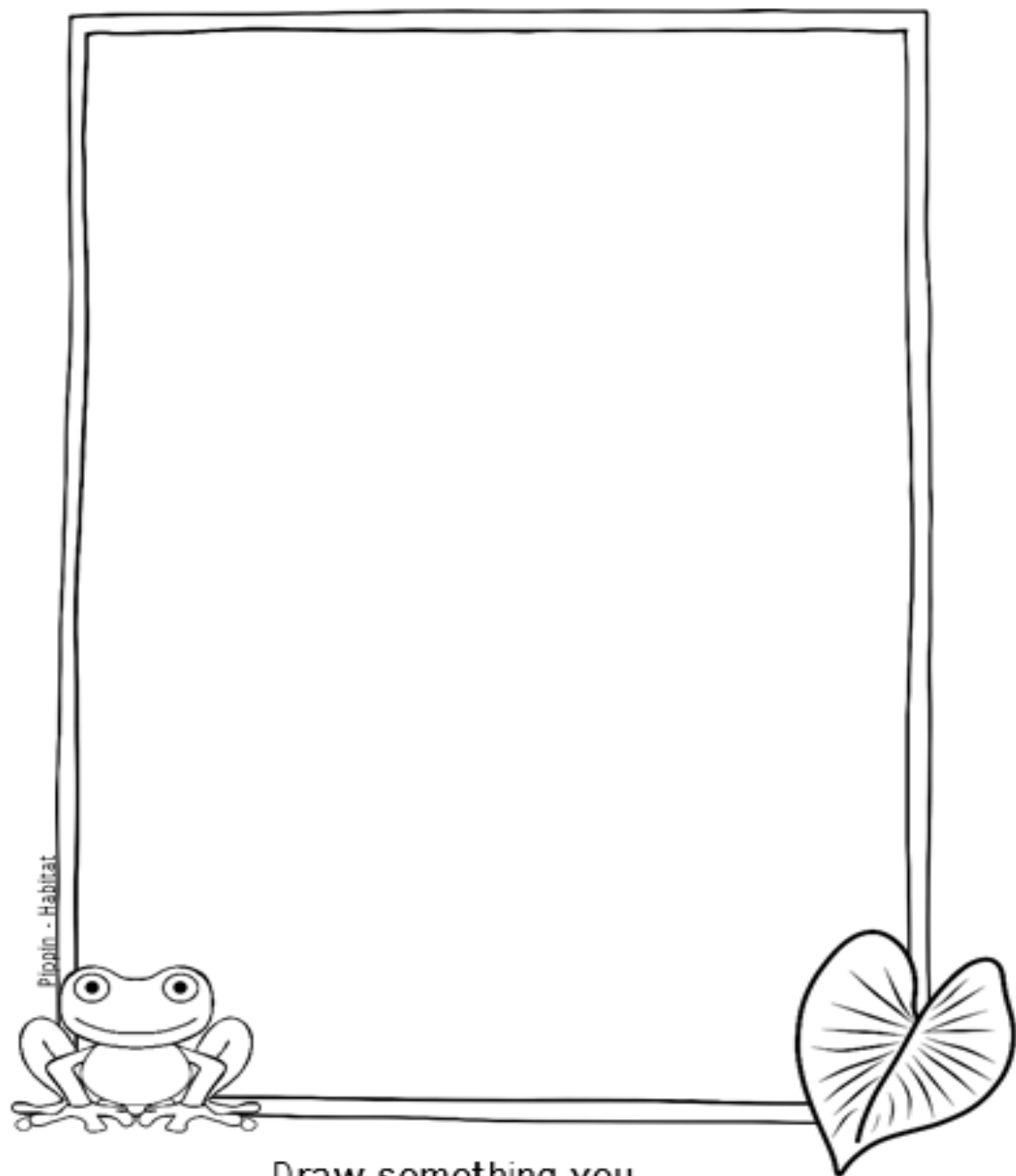
In the Rainforest

The plants in the rainforest are important to the world, helping make air for us to breathe.



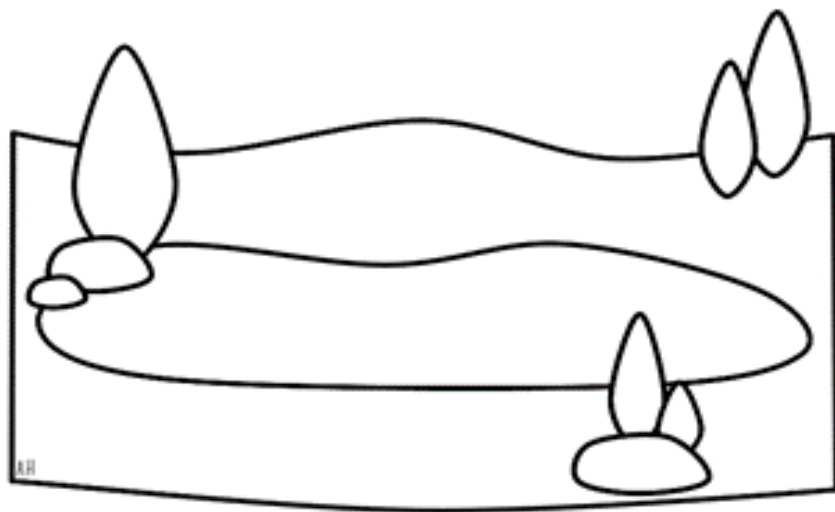

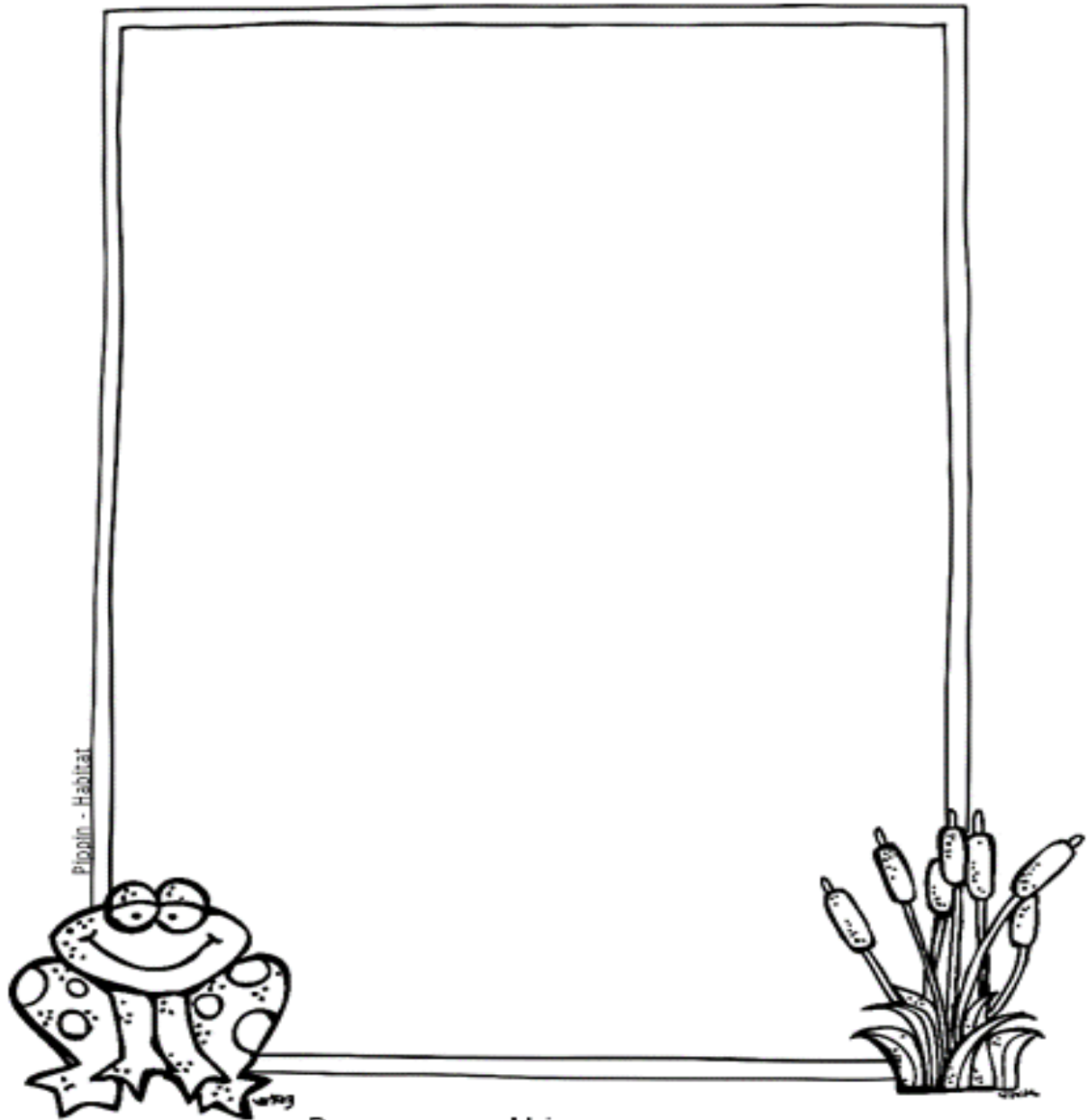
By a Pond

This small habitat has all its inhabitants need without ever having to leave their home.



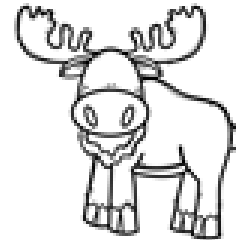
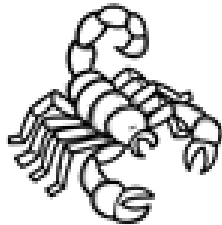
